

## Il Torrione

The II Torrione estate is located near Gualdo Cattaneo in Saragano, a parish that takes its name from the Roman consul Lucio Licinio Sura, who was famous enough to have some of his battles immortalized on the Trajan column in Rome. The estate grows Sagrantino, Sangiovese, Merlot and Trebbiano Spoletino on roughly 40 hectares at an average altitude of 350 meters above sea level. The estate is also a country retreat and rents rooms and apartments to vacationers from all over the world. I have only recently begun tasting the wines from this estate, but I'd say they are showing considerable promise.
